The epitope recognized by A304-516A maps to a region between residue 250 to 300 of human DNAI Homolog Subfamily A Member 1 using the numbering given in entry NP_001530.1 (GeneID

3301).

Antibody concentration was determined by extinction coefficient: absorbance at 280 nm of 1.4

equals 1.0 mg of IgG.


